## SCAPES CAPTORS, SAVES RANSOM



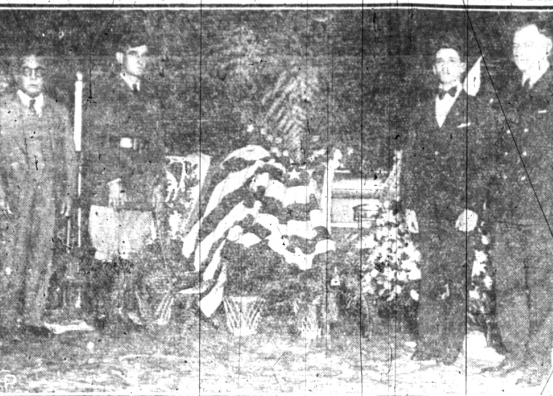

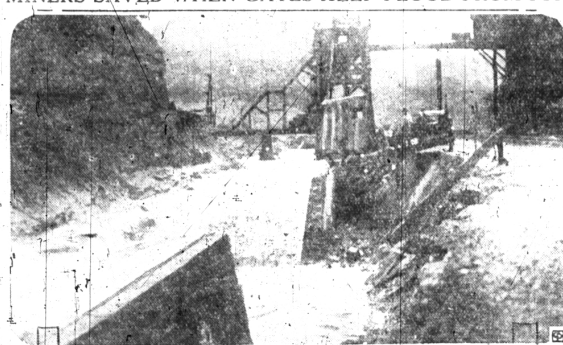

## MINERS SAVED WHEN GATES KEEP FLOOD FROM PIT



Flood waters from streams in the hill section of eastern Ohio nearly brought tragedy to 500 coal miners in the Webb mine at Steadyville, O., who were underground when the flood covered the pit mouth.
