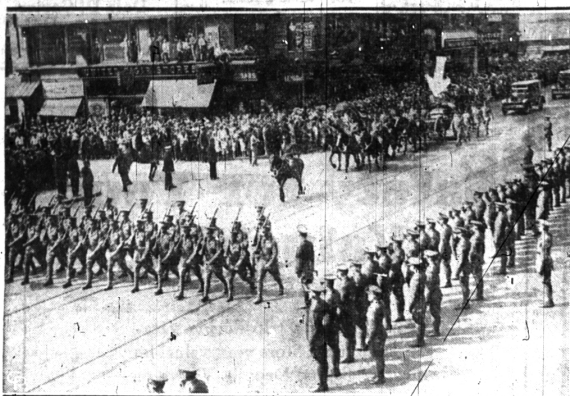

NATION PAYS FINAL TRIBUTE TO MEXICAN AIR ACE



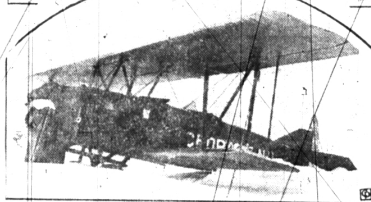

Rising Golf Star



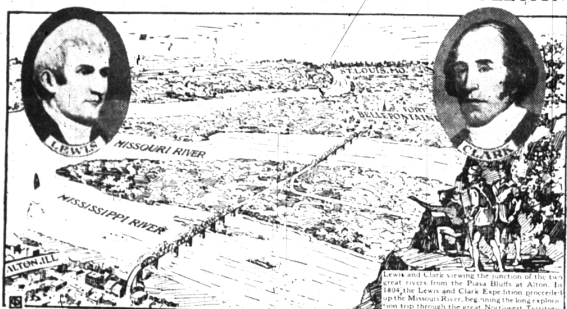

GIANT SPAN ACROSS TWO RIVERS NEARS COMPLETION



Transcontinental motor tourists who desire to avoid the congestion of St. Louis, Mo., and its vicinity will find a new and shorter route available after August 1, when two bridges which connect on each side of the Mississippi and Missouri rivers at Alton, Miss., and Fort Bellefontaine, Mo., are to be opened for traffic. The bridges have been christened Lewis and Clark, in honor of Capt. Meriwether Lewis and William Clark, who started their famous expedition to the northwest from that point in 1804. 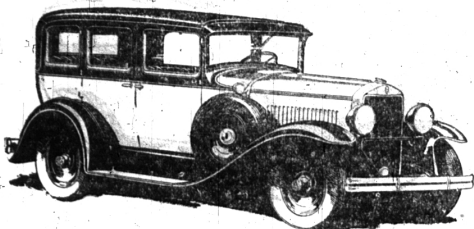
