Eilon A. Cooper, 21 years old and Alfreda E. Hall, 15, both of Birmingham have applied for a marriage license at county clerk's office tonight.

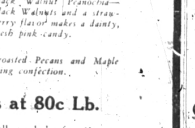
Bride Introduced At Hills Events
