Leaving Detroit by Woodward Avenue, the motorist drives to Pontiac, which is about 16 miles from the heart of the city, and one of the centers of General Motors activities, the city-weary motorist has the choice of six paved highways and several gravel roads, radiating from the heart of the city, and one of which will lead him to scores of lakes.

**The Favorite Path**

Commerce, Lake and Union Lakes and a hundred smaller bodies of water, and eventually leading to Detroit, the home of the General Motors proving grounds.

The left fork leads south of the Lower Stratts Lake, one of a chain of three, and brings the motorist to Walled Lake.

**Rolling Countryside**  
The Elizabeth Lake road, an other favored one, leads to Elizabeth, Crescent, Pleasant, Oxbow, and White Lakes, while passing through a rolling countryside that is a delight to the eye of an artist. To reach this road one turns to the west at the main corner of Pontiac, Saginaw and Huron streets, taking Huron street to State. At State street a left turn is made and after a four-block drive, the street runs to Elizabeth Lake road.

Lapeer road, M-24, running to the north out of Pontiac on Perry street, which parallels Saginaw one block east in the downtown section, leads to Lake Orion, Oxford and Stony Lake. It is a gravel road, in excellent condition.

Leaving Detroit at noon, one may, by charting his course from the road map, lay out a course that will take him to much of Oakland County's lakeland and will return him to Detroit by dinner time, after a refreshing swim in any one of the 400 lakes.

**Deodorants for Summer Daintiness**  
We all perspire. That seems a simple enough statement in itself, doesn't it? Add to it, this indisputable chemical fact—all perspiration has an odor. Sometimes it is very faint, sometimes it is recognizable, but whatever the degree, it is inharmonious unless you have definitely recognized the fact that perspiration is never entirely free from its own distinct odor.

It should not be difficult, then, for us to convince ourselves that every one of us needs some protection against the perspiration odors which are naturally more noticeable in the summer than at any other time.

Perspiration, while it is a pore function and thus distributed all over the body, nevertheless generally centers in the armpits and between the toes. Therefore, when you must take general precautionary measures to guard against this peril to summer daintiness, you must give particular heed to these particular places.

I have already told you of talc that is prepared to do double duty as a deodorant, and a talcum as well. A very simple and effective deodorant foot powder may be obtained by blending your own talcum with boric acid powder, 75 per cent talcum to 25 per cent boric acid.

Ordinary bi-carbonate of soda, which is no more than common baking soda, is an excellent deodorant and effective and non-irri-

### EMPLOYEES HOLD NEW 'HOBBY FAIR'

**Sternal Tells Of Stunt Pat On By Goodyear Company Workers**

"Unusual ability in many lines was demonstrated by employees of the Goodyear Tire & Rubber company during the 'hobby fair,' held recently in connection with the eighth anniversary of Goodyear Hall, an institution where educational and recreational activities of the workmen are centered," according to F. E. Sternal, who sells and services Goodyear tires at his service station at Woodward and Daines streets.

"The hobby fair," he said, "was only one of several interesting features of a three-day celebration, and gave employees at the big Akron factory an opportunity to display articles made by them during their spare time.

"The display included work done in wood, metal, painting, needlework, taxidermy, antiques, photography, fossils, toys, paper flowers, and even perfumes. The articles were inspected by thousands of visitors.

"Besides the hobby display, the celebration included a spelling bee, conducted by Goodyear Industrial University; a debate between teams representing Goodyear Industrial University and the Akron Municipal University, sporting events, dancing and other diversions.

"Goodyear Hall, which was built eight years ago for Goodyear employees, is a six-story building with complete facilities for educational, social and athletic activities. It is the meeting place

for all employees and houses quarters for employes' clubs with a total membership of 4,000.

"In the building are the classrooms of the university, which is the largest school of its kind in the country, with an enrollment during the 1927-28 school year of more than 1,500.
