Grand Trunk Proposal To Go To Commission

Action soon to be taken on the agreement between the village and the state relative to the grade separations in Birmingham for the new right of way. Manager James W. Parry said yesterday. It was not brought before the commission last Monday night at the regular meeting.

The agreement will call for the construction of two separations in the village; one at Maple avenue and the other on Adams avenue and the new right of way.

Meanwhile work is progressing on the excavations for the new road, approximately three quarters of a mile east of the present site of the tracks.

The minutes of the last annual meeting including the report of the secretary and treasurer were approved.

A brief report was then made of the affairs of the District for the school year of 1927-1928 by President R. J. Corryell and Supt. Clarence Vliet. No financial report for the year could be made since the fiscal year ends July 1, 1928 but a statement of budget expenditures was read and a complete financial report will be published after July 1, 1928.

The report of Dr. Arthur W. Newitt, Health Officer, concerning the results of his work in the Public Schools during the past year was received and discussed. Moved by Clarence Vliet supported by Fred W. Quorton that a vote of thanks be given Dr. Arthur Newitt by the District for his work during the past year. Carried.

The term of Mrs. C. E. Sears as citizen representative on the Birmingham Student Loan Fund having expired, she declined reelection and Mrs. Cora Farrar was nominated and elected to serve on said Birmingham Student Loan Fund for a two year term commencing July 1, 1928. Mr. Arthur Peck, Treasurer of said Fund, reported \$1600 in cash on hand and loans to 15 applicants of \$5400. The total resources of the Fund now aggregate approximately \$7000, about \$1000 having been added from gifts by the A. A. O. U. W., Ladies Literary Club, Senior Class and other organizations, as well as from the social affairs given under the direction

of the President, Mrs. C. E. Sears, during the past year.

The following report of the Annual Election was received:

The polls were declared open at 12 o'clock M.

The Board of Election Inspectors sworn in consisted of Martha D. Wilson, Blanche Blumberg, Elizabeth L. Osborn, Helen L. E. J. Corryell, LEIGH LYNCH, FRED V. QUORTON and RAY A. PALMER of whom Blanche Blumberg was selected by the qualified electors present to act as an inspector of Election together with the Board of Education. R. J. Corryell was chosen as Chairman of the Board of Election Inspectors, Ray A. Palmer as Secretary, and Blanche Blumberg as Inspector. A poll list was kept and a suitable ballot box provided and used. The polls were declared closed at 8 o'clock P. M. having been open for 8 consecutive hours upon the proposition.
