OAKLAND SIX SALES HIGH

Record For Five Months Topped By Pontiac Factory

Sales of Oakland and Pontiac Sixes during the first five months of this year reached a record total of 13,205 cars according to figures released at the factory this week. This volume of sales shows an increase of 49,019 or nearly 62 per cent over the 79,286 Oakland-Pontiac sales recorded during the first five months of 1927 when the Oakland Motor Car company was moving up from fifth to fifth place in the automotive industry. Oakland executives are making no predictions as to what position the company may attain by the end of the year. They merely point to the figures. On illuminating bit of data shows that when the year 1928 was only three months old, the sales of Oakland and Pontiac Sixes had reached a total of 74,118 which very nearly equals the sales registered by the company during the entire first five months of 1927. W. R. Tracy, vice-president in charge of sales, states that the increased factory facilities now are adequate to take care of the growing volume of orders.
