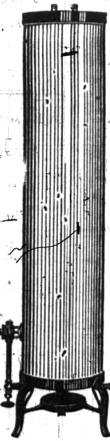

ing to the report she received. "It was difficult to ascertain whether the report was true or not," she says. Accordingly, I spent considerable time in the neighborhood, visiting neighbors, and living near to see for myself the truth of the rumor. Finally after nearly six months' investigation, I decided that it was true, and accordingly visited the mother. Often it takes this much investigation before anything can be done."

In many cases she finds that it is necessary to resort to the filing of a petition in juvenile court, when the defendant refuses to admit her guilt. These petitions are filed on charges of neglect and many other charges. Often she is called in to work with the friend of the court in Oakland, and sometimes Wayne County where cases go into that district. She has made arrangements for four adoptions of babies in the village. She has placed girls from the Adrian Industrial School in private homes as maids. inmates of the school are placed in private homes if they show themselves responsible and desirous.

During the past year she has handled more than 250 cases, she reports.

"There is always work for a policeman. Usually I am not so happy because one may feel that the results are going to make for more happiness among people."

Mrs. Jardine declares it is so fascinating that she does not like to think of leaving the field and probably will continue her activities in Bay City.

Her philosophy, after being in contact with so many of the world's ills, is not so pessimistic as one might imagine. "People always seem to be good at heart," she said. Sometimes they wander a bit but they are always far happier when they are right with society.

### TROY OPPOSES NEW CEMETERY

Residents Ask Action Against Proposed Grounds in Township

A group of Troy residents have filed litigation in circuit court to prevent laying out of a cemetery in Troy Township. They are Edward and Russell Bruce, John and Samuel Martin, Catherine Hawthorne, Harry E. Davis, Leonolo Joslin, and Archibald and Marie Cooper. The litigation is filed against the Arlington Memorial Association and the board of health of the township, which is composed of Morris Wattles, Garner Miller, William Walker, and Lynn Richards.

The Arlington Memorial Association was granted the right to lay out a cemetery in the southeast quarter of Section 36 of Troy Township by the board of health on May 3. A cemetery on this location would according to the plaintiffs, all of whom are farmers, detract from the value of the property, housing being a general nuisance. There are now seven cemeteries in the township.

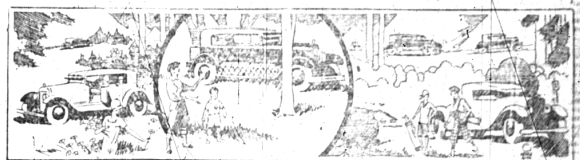
