FIRE EQUIPMENT NOW REPLACED

Testing Days Are Passed And There Is No More Running Around.

Those of the village citizenry who have looked in wonder at the frequent appearance recently on Woodward avenue of a fire truck when not a single spiral of smoke was in sight, need look no more. The mystery is solved.

All that playful maneuvering on the part of the truck and its merry crew was a simple testing out of the new engine installed last week after it was decided that the old engine, acquired eight years ago, was too unreliable a part of the fire department.

Two weeks were spent putting in the new parts at a cost of \$275 for the transmission and \$295 for the motor, according to Vern Griffith of the department, and about \$500 more went for repainting and other incidentals. That means the village of Birmingham has acquired practically a new fire truck for \$1,000 and has saved about \$5,000, he said. A new truck, according to Mr. Griffith, costs between \$5,000 and \$10,000.

During the past year, the truck with the repaired engine has broken down several times, especially on out of town calls, Mr. Griffith said, and the replacement was a necessity.
