

\$3,000,000 LOT ORDER OPENS G.M.C. FACTORY

All Officials of New General Motors Truck Corporation Now in Office PLAN AN OPEN HOUSE

The new General Motors Truck Corporation in Bloomfield Township got away to a rapid start Saturday morning when Paul W. Seiler, president, arrived and operations production started immediately on a single order for \$3,000,000 worth of trucks.

All officials of the new \$3,000,000 plant on south Boulevard, Pontiac, are at their offices today having arrived early this week.

At the close of work Friday afternoon in Detroit, the office furnishings equipment and files were loaded into a long fleet of trucks and all during the night the almost endless caravan of trucks continued from Detroit to Pontiac.

Corridors, hallways and a few offices in the new building are not yet completed, however, but will be finished soon.

Scientist Speaker Declares Christianity Must Be Exact

Key to the Scriptures," giving to the world her discovery in a clear and concise manner and turning all her followers to the daily study of the Scriptures. This textbook is not only in no way a substitute for the Bible, but it is a book that no book has ever been written that has caused a deeper or more concentrated study of the Scriptures than has this book.

Revelation of Christ

It is the vision of the Christ which is revealed in the last chapter of Genesis as God's image and likeness, the spiritual man, infinitely good and having dominion over all things. It was his perception of Christ, or of spiritual nature, which enabled Jacob to leave the false gods of his fathers and to go out to seek a higher perception of God, and to whom he gave obedience.

It was the understanding of Christ as revealing the spiritual nature, which enabled Jacob to perceive that the truth of his being was always "Irract," a prince of God, and not a mortal; and it was the vision of Christ at the burning bush and at Mount Sinai which enabled Moses to guide the Israelites through many trials and to give them a full understanding of God and a true sense of His law. It was Christ who appeared to Job and revealed to him the allness of spiritual being, and the nothingness and nakedness of material existence; and it was his perception of God, which eventually delivered him from his afflictions.

It was also the vision of the Christ, or spiritual man, which enabled the Virgin to perceive the divine fact that God alone is the Father of man, and that the true man was not born of a material father and mother, but forever co-existed with God; and his understanding of Christ enabled her to bring forth the man Christ Jesus.

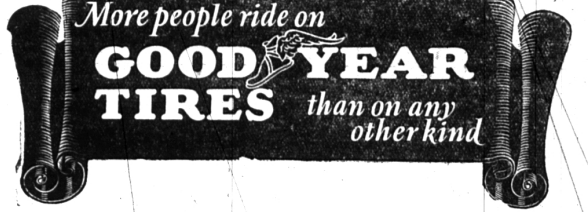
