4 TRACKSTERS WIN HONORS

Relay Team Takes First Inter-scholastic Meet in Ann Arbor

Four Birmingham trackmen to day possess medals from the 28 annual interscholastic track and field meet held at the University of Michigan, Friday and Saturday. The Maroon lightnings were pitted against an aggregation of more than 40 athletes of Michigan representing 35 schools, and tied among the 20 point-winning schools for 10 place with Pontiac and Ann Arbor, having compiled five points. Major honors in the meet were carried off by Detroit Northwestern High School who won the games with 26 points, and Northwestern who closely followed with 27 5-6.

Unexpected merit was demonstrated by the Baldwin relay quartet, who copied second place in the half mile relay, running more than one first to Northwestern and beat the Eastern, who ran in third place. Milton Porteous, Harry York, Milton Thomson and Robert Lyon were the boys whose combined efforts in sprinting and passing the baton gained this place. The Maroon youths ran the event in the time of 1:35.4. The winning time was 1:35.
