This possibility is being considered so that provisions may be made in the school budget which is to be completed by July 15, Clarence Vliet, superintendent, said.

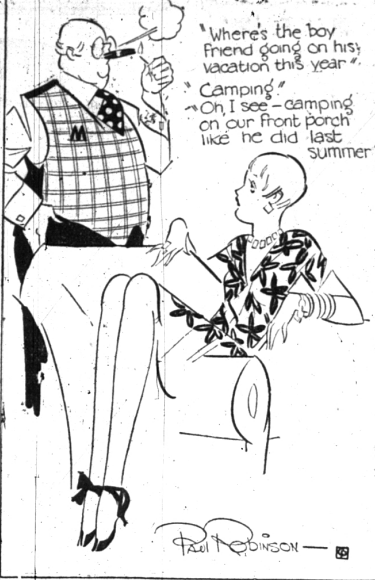
The crowded condition of Birmingham schools and the fact that night classes offer opportunity for many more persons to gain an education was given as the reason for the proposal.

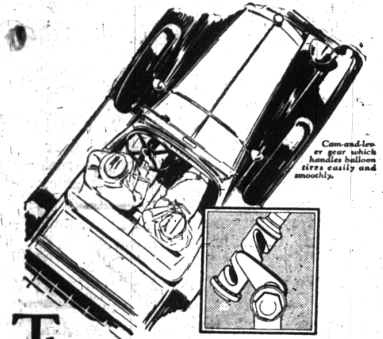

HOW to Achieve Beauty

CARE OF HANDS AUGMENTS BEAUTY

There are many women who forget the importance of their hands, until wrinkles, discolorations—all the indisputable signs of age, confront them and visibly proclaim their years and their neglect.

There are other women who thoughtfully, carefully protect the surface, by hand bleach, and anti-wrinkle creams and lotions, and milk and rose-halm-protectives to keep their hands soft, white and smooth; and yet forget that there is more to real beauty than the exterior loveliness.

There is beauty of movement, which will remain with you forever, and this perhaps is the loveliness most difficult to do without, most simple to acquire and most frequently neglected.

It is easy enough to pat in creams and lotions; your dressing table may be laden with jars and bottles, with rouge and manicure implements, but whatever beauty, patience, scientific care and skill may develop, it will be nullified if your hand motions are stiff and heavy, your fingers all thumbs and your movements unrelated and awkward.

You see, as we progress we find more and more that there is something—a component part of loveliness, undoubtedly, which looks beyond exterior perfection for its ultimate beauty.

Have you ever noticed the slim,

pale beauty of wrists and tapering fingers that distinguish the master-pieces of art at the museums?

Nothing could show more completely the loveliness we should all aspire to. Perhaps the first of all charms I advise you to cultivate is the grace of repose. Fidgety hands are destructive, not only to your nerves, but to your appearance as well.

Next, you must remember that the grace of gentleness is most essential to charm. Think always that your hands are proud parts of your beauty, and you will never be guilty of such ugly movements as snatching or grabbing. Place things—don't fling them. Make each motion an arc, the part of a curve, for linear movements are always sharp. Curved ones are soft and lovely.

I think that the prettiest description of hands I have ever heard comes from the Kashmiri Love Song—"Pale hands, pink tipped, like lotus buds afloat." It does express completely all the softness, the charm and the gentleness which lovely hands may possess.

Try relaxing your hands for beauty. Try to imitate with your arms the undulations of a swan's neck. Raise them shoulder high and lower them gradually in a succession of drooping curves to your sides, so relaxed that you seem to feel the pressure of the air.

Shape your finger tips gently every time you wash your hands, and pat in a little hand cream, a rich semi-flush pasteurized cream, if you prefer, and press gently at the head of each nail to cultivate and develop the slim, taper-like fingers which are so charming and artistic.

I remember the admonition of my teacher long ago to "Compose your hands, Made-moiselle." Give yourself that same command, for if you develop ease and grace of movement, beauty has been attained. And remember that soft, peaceful motions transform your hands into lyrics of grace and loveliness.

LARGEST ANIMAL

Marine zoologists tell us that the biggest of all living animals is the blue whale, which attains a length of ninety feet and a weight of thirty tons. The creatures on which it feeds are marine invertebrates, and the water turns upon smaller ones, until the fundamental basis of surface vegetation is reached.

The amount of food required for a full grown whale can be imagined when it is explained that a herd of cattle equalling its weight would need for their maintenance more than half a square mile of fertile pasture land. A blue whale swimming at high speed travels at a rate of about thirty miles an hour, using approximately 650 horsepower.

PRIZES MOUNT IN STATE FAIR

Detroit, May 23.—Prizes totaling more than \$125,000 will be awarded at the Michigan State Fair, Sept. 2-8, the most impressive premium list in the history of the fair, according to State Fair officials.

Last year the prizes were approximately \$107,000.

Awards for live stock, pot stock and poultry, amounting to \$44,115 are included in the largest general appropriation. A prize list of \$50,250, for racing and blooded horses, will attract some of the noted horsemen and racing stables in the country. Draft and standard-bred horses are included in this total.

In order to do justice to the exhibits at the fair, a visitor should devote at least one whole day and two nights to seeing the fair.

Rubber Demands Reach High Figure

The demands of the world for rubber through products that are indispensable to our present mode of living, require 371,000 long tons of the crude product to fill each year, according to material survey engineers of the B. F. Goodrich Rubber company, Akron, O.

Since rubber must be taken from certain tropical trees in the form of latex, which is more than sixty per cent water, it takes 332½ million gallons of the milky fluid to produce the tonnage required to supply the rubber manufacturing industry just in America.

The rubber latex or milk is not an emulsion as is commonly supposed, but a fluid in which, Goodrich chemists say, are suspended microscopic particles of solid rubber matter. These particles are so numerous and their powers of adhesion are so great that one gallon of this white rubber-tree sap contains enough of the rubber globules to form a minute thread 372 miles long.

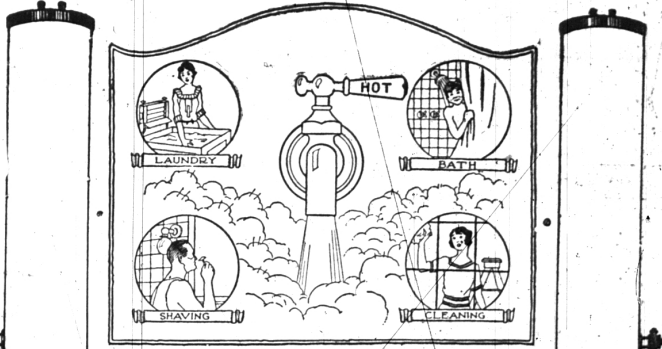
