

### FOUR RABID HORSES SHOT

#### Sheriff Orders Infected Animals Killed As Precaution Against Rabie Spread

Four rabid horses were shot last week by Sheriff Frank Schram and Deputy C. C. Johnson at the Grindley farm in Spring field Township, the shooting was

ordered by B. J. Killham, state veterinarian, who examined the horses after they had been bitten by a dog.

Two of the animals were owned by Mann and two by M. Shanahan of the Keego Riding Stables. The horses had been kept at the Mann farm and were never in contact with the horses which Shanahan is now renting for riding purposes at his stables. Sheriff Schram stated that Shanahan's horses at Keego Harbor are entirely free from the disease and have never been exposed to it.

The shooting of the four horses Sunday comes after the killing of one horse a few days ago and the death of 17 sheep as the result of attacks made on the animals by a mad dog about three weeks ago.

Boisterous Bill Regan One Of Few Red Sox Shining Lights



Boisterous Bill Regan, the boy was due greatly to ill health and a period in which he adjusted himself to the faster play of the big circuit.

This season Regan has fielded with the best of them, and while he does not tote an extremely potent war club, he is a timely hitter and can place the batted ball into any field.

Higher road speeds, more congested highways, and greater traffic density in cities made it imperative that automobile brakes function with a wide margin of safety, according to Claude Mosher, local Studebaker-Erskine dealer.

### MONTREAL HARBOR IS TO BE DEAPENED

A greater depth of water is to be provided in Montreal harbor, according to the Canadian Deputy Minister of Marine and Fisheries. By the construction of even submerged weirs between the island of Montreal and Sorel, it is estimated that the submerged weirs will be finished in two years at a cost of \$1,000,000. An additional two feet of water will then be available in the harbor of Montreal, permitting a minimum of thirty feet of water to be kept all year round.

These measures are expected to avert the variable water levels of the St. Lawrence River at Montreal, which have been attributed by some authorities to the diversion of water from Lake Michigan to the Mississippi River through the Chicago drainage canal.
