Tax Rate Lowest Here in Five Years

Assessed Valuation Increases Three Million And Rate Drops To \$12 Per Thousand

Birmingham's tax rate is lower for this year than it has been in five years.

A rate of \$12 per \$1,000 was decided upon by the village commission Monday night when Robert McClellan, village assessor, submitted his report.

The assessed valuation of Birmingham for this year shows an increase of approximately \$3,000,000.

The reduction in the tax rate is considered remarkable in view of the fact that Birmingham is undergoing more improvements than at any time in its history.
