RETAIN INTERURBAN SERVICE!

On Saturday, December 1, there will be submitted to the Voters of Troy Township a Street Railway Ordinance, running to EAST-ERN MICHIGAN RAILWAYS, which upon approval by a majority of the voters thereon will secure to the people the certainty of continued interurban service.

Under the Ordinance the present rate of fare will be continued, the rate being subject from time to time to review by the Michigan Public Commission which, under the state law, has full and ample authority to determine the rate of fare after full and complete survey and investigation.

Under the Ordinance the Company is obli-tated to build and keep in repair all road approaches and crossings to the complete atisfaction of the authorities.

Under the Ordinance and in addition to all stops made by the Local passenger cars the Company obligates itself to MAKE ON SIGNAL AT LEAST TWO STOPS TO THE MILE OF ITS EXPRESS PASSENGER CARS. The location of these stops will be determined by the local authorities. This is an improved OBLIGATORY service to the public over what it now being given.
