DUE IN 30 DAYS

Preparations Made for Housing Equipment in Hills

Bloomfield Hills Village expects to receive a new American LaFrance chemical truck within the next 30 days, according to information made known this week by Luther D. Allen, president. The apparatus will carry four huge chemical pumps, and a complete foamite freighting equipment. The truck will be housed in a specially built station in the new Barbours garage on west Long Lake road.

Plans are also going forward by Bloomfield Hills Village officials to engage two paid firemen, one for day and one for nights; they

would be augmented by assistance from their police department and volunteers. At present Bloomfield Hills Village is depending upon Birmingham's chemical truck for aid in combating fires.


