PROGRESS IN JUVENILE CRIME MEASURES REPORTED BY COURT

Annual reports of the juvenile division of the Probate Court in Pontiac show progress in methods of dealing with juvenile criminality.

The juvenile court has been handling all cases of children under 17 years since its establishment in 1907 as part of probate court. According to the law, children are placed in three classes: delinquent, dependent and neglected. The law makes it illegal to

confine any juvenile with an adult person as was previously done. Only after a thorough investigation of the child's case will the juvenile be brought into court.

Many Hearings

During the past year 449 such petitions have been filed and 602 court hearings held. This has involved 1,203 children. Of these 29 have been committed to the Boy's Vocational school at Lansing; 5 to Girl's Training school, Adrian; 4 to Starr Commonwealth for boys, Albion; 7 to Ford Republic for boys, Farmington; 50 to Michigan State public school, Coldwater; 2 to American Legion billet, Otter Lake; 6 to denominational institutions. A total of 90 cases have been dismissed; 57 boys and girls are on probation; 40 children have been made wards of the court; 19 cases are pending and 51 cases have been continued.

The report shows that the County is paying board for 59 dependent children, 23 of whom are state wards pending admittance to state institutions. During the year 102 afflicted children have been cared for and 89 adoptions approved. In the county 600 licensed boarding homes have been approved and licensed, 180 of these within the past year. At present 20 boys on parole are reporting to Frank S. Jackson, county agent for correction and charities, who is connected with the juvenile work.

Follow Same Plan
Work with delinquent girls follows the same plan of investigation of the individual case, Miss Evan Karpinski, girls' probation officers supervising this work.

The mother's pension law passed in 1913 by Michigan has since been adopted by 42 states with but slight modification. The present pension roll contains a list of 141 families with 475 dependent children. This number includes 114 widows, 8 deserted mothers, 7 divorced and deserted mothers, 6 where the father is in the Tuberculosis Sanitarium, 4 of which the father is confined in a state penal institution and 1 of which the father is in an institution for insane.

In this number of 141 families, 38 families live in Pontiac township, 67 in Royal Oak township, and 36 families have residence in various other townships in the county. Approximately, the residence is as follows: Royal Oak township 47.5 per cent, Pontiac, 27 per cent, other townships, 25.5 per cent.

To obtain a pension, the mother files a sworn application with the probation officer. She also supplies information relative to family history, property, and income. It is the duty of the probation officer to investigate the home and all facts bearing upon the case. A day is set for hearing with the Probate Judge, who bases his decision upon the written report filed by the probation officer.

Apportion Money
A sum of \$62,083 has been apportioned to families of dependent children during the past year. The
