

Third Dies In Troy Interurban Crashes

PROBE CALLED INTO FATAL ACCIDENT

Robert Garret Instantly Killed As He Drives Auto Across Tracks

INQUEST ON SATURDAY

The third death and the fourth serious accident in two months, as the result of interurban crashes on Main street in Troy Township,

took place Friday morning. Robert Garret, of Troy, was injured fatally when a southbound car struck his machine as he drove in front of it at Main street and Hickory road.

He was driving north on Main street when he made a right turn in front of the interurban car bound for Detroit.

He was picked up by Al Brownell, 2121 east Jefferson avenue, Detroit, a passing motorist, after his car was dragged for a considerable distance in front of the interurban. He was hurried to the office of Dr. Fred T. Reid of Clawson but died on the way. Albert Dunn, Rochester, was motorist and the conductor was George Hickson, Rochester.

An inquest will be held Saturday at 10:30 a. m. according to

Coroner O. C. Farmer. The body was removed to the Stillman funeral parlors in Royal Oak. Dunn was the sole occupant of the car. He is survived by a widow and four children.

George A. Cornsant, Edgewood avenue, Royal Oak, was killed at Main street, near the Sixteen Mile road, when his car stalled on the track, on Oct. 24.

Thirty persons escaped fatal injury when the north bound interurban leaped the track at the curve on Main street and the Twenty Mile road Oct. 4. One was injured seriously and all others sustained cuts and bruises. Beaver was instantly killed when he failed to see the southbound interurban at Main street and the Big Beaver road, Sept. 10.

Zone Meetings At Franklin Are Planned By Helping Teachers

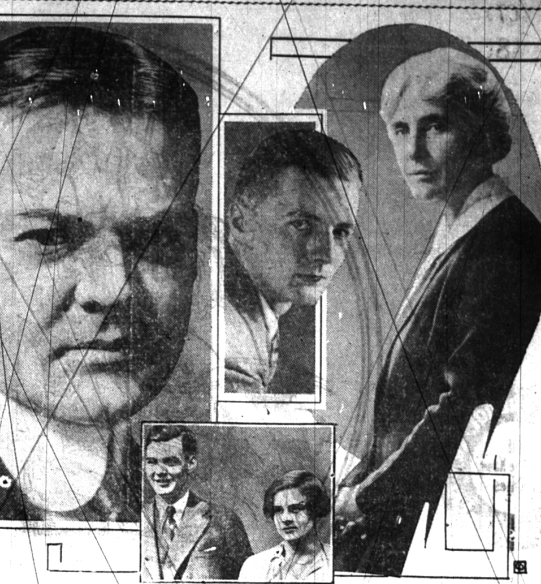
