Plans Made For Revival Of Bouts In Royal Oak; First Card Nov. 2

Royal Oak, Oct. 24.—Principals are signed today for the final and semi-final events of the Royal Oak Athletic Club indoor boxing season starting Friday night, Nov. 2, at the Martin & Sons Bus Terminal on University avenue in Royal Oak.
A schedule of bouts will be conducted in the building, which has a seating capacity of 800, throughout the winter it is managed by Charles Letich, matchmaker and manager.
In the main event on the opening card Billy Monck of Detroit is pitted against Eddie Hamell of Toledo. Both are to weigh in at 135 pounds or under, and the fight is scheduled for 10 rounds.
Monck appeared on the program in three different occasions during the Royal Oak open air season, once twice knocking Jackie DeMoro to sleep and finishing a colored boxer from Mt. Clemens.
Hamell, is touted in Cleveland as one of the state's best lightweights having won the majority
