Kahn sees Gerswin as typical of American youth, unspooled and naive with considerable talent and courage. "In the rhythm, the melody, the grace, the humor, the rush and sweep and dynamics of his compositions, he expresses the

genius of young America," Kahn has said. "There is one quality, however, which Kahn finds lacking in Gerswin's art. There is little of the underlying anguish which is the basis of the great art." It is a note which conspicuously absent in all American art, Kahn points out.
