

NEW BUILDING COMPLETION TO BE STARTED

Third Floor Of Wabeek Structure Will Be Finished Ahead Of Schedule

PACE NEARLY FILLED

The demand for office space in the new Wabeek building, Birmingham, headquarters for the various interests of Senator James Joussens, has been so great, according to Colgrove, Buck & Tilson, the leasing agents, that the owners are completing the third floor nearly a year ahead of the originally anticipated date.

The new Wabeek building, which has a frontage of 210 feet on Maple avenue and a depth of 100 feet on Bates street, was finished Sept. 1, and comprises 10 stories on the ground floor and

space for 25 offices on the second floor.

The third floor was not finished. All the shops were rented by the time the building was completed, with all the offices of the second floor now taken, which has necessitated the finishing of the third floor, already partially rented.

The building is of limestone and is equipped with elevators, and is one of the finest office buildings in America for a community the size of Birmingham as every known convenience to the building profession was included in Albert Kahn's original plans, it is generally stated.

GIRL SCOUTS PLAN CAMP

County Groups Obtain Own Grounds For This Season

The Oakland County Girl Scout Council is planning to camp on its own grounds this summer. Previous to this year Oakland County Girl Scouts have camped at the Boy Scout Camp at Tommy's Lake or at the Y. M. C. A. Camp near Fenton. The new camp will be open to all girls of Oakland County who have passed the Tenderfoot test. Two periods of two weeks each will be offered in July, during which instruction in Girl Scouting will be given.

Girl Scouts in the county have grown in number from 64 at the time of the first camp in 1921 to 675 at the present time.

A camp site near Lapeer was purchased last summer by the Oakland County Council members. The site includes 2600 feet of lake frontage and 56 acres of timber.

While the headquarters of the organization are in Pontiac at the Board of Commerce, many troops have been organized throughout the county. There are at the present time troops at Franklin, Farmington, Sylvan Lake, Keego Harbor, Walled Lake, Rochester, Bloomfield Highlands, New Hudson, South Lyon, Drayton Plains, Waterford, Holly, Oxford, Auburn Heights, and Birmingham.

Miss Helen Goodale is director of the organization and will direct the camp next summer assisted by a staff.
