### Slow Motion Autoists On Woodward Called Dangerous

#### START WAR ON SEPT. 1

Traffic on Woodward between Detroit and Pontiac will not be hampered by slow moving cars driving on the left or in the center of the road after Sept. 1, following action taken by police officials of municipalities along Woodward avenue, and officers of the Detroit Automobile club. Slow moving vehicles will be forced to travel on the right or be fined for violating the state law.


Police officials declared that these slow moving cars were not only slowing up traffic on Woodward but were endangering lives and property of others.

The following police chiefs unanimously agreed to the enforcing of this portion of the state law: James Anderson, Birmingham; William A. Putnam, Bloomfield Hills; F. E. Alsbaugh, Pontiac; Roy Reynolds, Ferndale; and Lieutenant R. A. Graves, Huntington Woods. Commissioner J. H. Lobb, Pleasant Ridge, agreed to join with the other municipalities before the middle of September.

## GARAGE BURNS IN VILLAGE

### Damage High In Blaze, But Home Is Saved; Grass Fires Continue

A garage and two automobiles were destroyed by fire at 5 p. m. Saturday at the home of H. B. Barrett, 709 Emmons street, resulting in damages estimated at between \$1,300, and \$1,400. The garage, a frame structure, was reduced to embers in a few minutes with the help of the strong wind that fanned the flames. A sedan and a truck inside the garage were demolished.

A house, valued at \$7,000 in close proximity was not damaged. Members of the Birmingham fire department were able to protect the dwelling from the flying sparks.

Among other fires over the week end was the destruction of a pump house on the old Kregger farm on Adams road. The loss was estimated at about \$200. Burning grass caused this fire.

Since August 24 the village department has answered 16 grass fire alarms. In most cases grass was burning near buildings and endangering property, but slight damages resulted from any of them, the department reports.
