THE MIRACLE
Morris Gest, the American producer, has made arrangements whereby "The Miracle," the famous pantomime drama, will be staged at the Olympia in Detroit for four weeks beginning Monday evening, Oct. 7, and continuing until Nov. 2.

"The Miracle" has had an international success and, since its first performance in 1912, has played in only 10 American cities. It is of such mammoth size that only cities with large auditoriums can stage the spectacle. Mr. Gest is building an entirely new production this year. It is now in the process of construction, partly at the Olympia in Detroit and partly at the studios in New York. It will be modeled after the original New York production, but with such improvements as experience has suggested. There will be also an entirely new set of costumes.

In order to stage "The Miracle" in Detroit the entire interior of the Olympia will be transformed into a Gothic cathedral. The action of the play is laid in the twelfth century, and in those days all great spectacles took place in the cathedrals of the large European cities.
