

### VILLAGERS WARNED AGAINST FAULTY XMAS TREE LIGHTING

A warning to citizens against the use of cheap or unapproved electric lighting systems for illuminating Christmas trees in homes during the holiday season was issued yesterday by Village Electrical Inspector Alvin Mudge.

"While electric lights are much safer for illuminating Christmas trees than the familiar old wax candles, all decorative electric lighting systems are not safe," said Inspector Mudge. "To prevent a fire which might result in

loss of life, or destroy your home, the electrical inspection department asks that you use only lighting sets approved by this department.

"Good sets which are safe are not usually more expensive than sets of poor or doubtful quality. Furthermore, the sets approved by the department are sold by a large number of representative electrical shops and department stores in this city. Call Birmingham 1390 for information regarding approved lighting systems."
