## ADAMS JUNIOR STUDENTS PLAN QUINNET LOSES TO BALDWIN

Music And Prayer Will Mark Baldwin High Assembly

## Green And White Cagers Win, 19 To 12, In First Contest

A rigid defense which held the Adams Junior High School basketball team to two baskets in the first enabled the Baldwin Junior cagers to defeat the former team in the first of the two-game series between the schools' Friday, 19 to 12.

More than 300 students, parents and basketball enthusiasts crowded the stands in the Adams school gymnasium to watch the struggle between these rival Birmingham quintets.

All of the Adams' scores were registered from center court, the Baldwin defense beneath their basket proving too strong for them to score from close quarters. The Baldwin defense in the goal zone was so close, in fact, that the game was slowed down until the third and fourth quarters.

**Baldwin Scores First**  
The Baldwin quintet registered the first score when Bunyan tossed the spher through the basket after a rapid passing combination with McKee and Canever on the floor. The Adams' defense was broken up. The contest during the remainder of the first quarter was close, neither team scoring.

Schwartz tied the score shortly after the opening of the second quarter but his lone tally was of little use as the Adams' defense, headed by Anderson, shot through the Adams' defense, making the score, Baldwin 8, Adams 4.

The fourth found both quintets battling furiously, Adams scoring eight points to Baldwin's 10. Baldwin managed to keep its strong lead established early in the contest and by an excellent defense, held the struggling Adams cagers in check.

Canever, with eight points, was the high scorer. Bunyan was second with six. Schwartz scored four field goals for the Adams' team. Brown, Whittaker, McKee and Forester showed good form on defense.
