

SALE OF SEALS GETS SUPPORT

Health Organization Aided In Fight Against Tuberculosis

A nation-wide health campaign embracing hundreds of local societies, such as the Oakland County Tuberculosis Association, and forty-eight state associations, with the National Tuberculosis Association, flung support in the December sale of penny Christmas seals, states the Michigan Tuberculosis Association in explaining the disposition of funds raised in the sale.

"In a movement as complex as must necessarily be one that seeks to cope successfully with tuberculosis, a complete, and therefore complex, organization is necessary," declares T. J. Werle, executive secretary of the

Association. "Each type of association, national, state, and local, has its special responsibilities, and each is vitally important to the success of the entire crusade."

The National Tuberculosis Association, according to Mr. Werle, directs research work, organizes special campaigns, prepares material such as is used in the Christmas seal sale, and maintains a staff of specialists for local advisory work.

"State tuberculosis associations," Mr. Werle says, "act as clearing houses for transfer of materials, as consultants for local societies, and at the same time carry on active educational work within their state boundaries. The Michigan Tuberculosis Association, among its other activities, has during the past year given five chest examinations to 2,100 patients and its speakers have addressed in excess of 100,000 persons."

A number of activities, varying with local conditions, are carried on by county tuberculosis societies, states Mr. Werle. Included are free chest clinics, summer

campus for children, tuberculosis nursing service, distribution of literature, and conduct of health programs in the schools.

The present sale of Christmas seals, the twenty-first to be conducted in the United States, will come to a close on Christmas Day.

SEEKS CHANGES IN TRAP CONTROL

Conservation Body Reorganizes Predatory Animal Rule System

Lansing, Dec. 22.—In an effort to speed up complete control of predatory animals in Michigan the Conservation Commission will obtain the services of a representative of the United States Biological Survey to reorganize and assume charge of its predatory animal control system.

This move of the part of the Conservation Commission at its last regular meeting, met with the entire approval of upper peninsula sheep raisers and cattle men, and others interested in predatory animal control.

It was a representative of the U. S. Biological Survey who originally organized the system now in use in Michigan—the state

trapper system. Under this system, a group of experienced trappers are employed by the Department of Conservation and are compensated in accordance with the number of predatory animals they kill.

"The man to assume head of this work will have charge but will be completely responsible to the Department," according to George E. Hogarth, director of the Department of Conservation.
