#### Soviet Relations Opposed Until Propaganda Ends

(Hamilton Fish, Jr., was born at Garrison, N. Y., Dec. 7, 1888. He is a graduate of Harvard university where he studied law. Vice president of a general insurance company, he was elected to the New York assembly in 1919. In 1919 he was elected to congress to fill a vacancy from the 28th New York district and has been returned each term since. He is a Republican and a World War veteran.)

The American people have nothing but friendship in their hearts for the 150,000,000 people who compose the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics, and the congress of the United States in 1921, by appropriating \$20,000,000 from the federal treasury to provide foodstuffs for the famine-stricken sections of Russia showed in a concrete way out sympathy and good will towards the Russian people.

The government of the United States is willing and ready to formally recognize the Soviet government whenever satisfactory guarantees are offered that the Third International will cease its insidious propaganda and attempts to interfere with our internal and domestic affairs, and that payment be made for property of American citizens confiscated by the Soviet government, and that the loans made by the United States to the Keresky government be recognized and funded on a fair basis.

The most important stipulation by far has to do with the continuation of underground interference with purely American affairs by the directors of the Red International from their headquarters at Moscow. The Third International is the child of Lenin and it is one and inseparable with the Russian

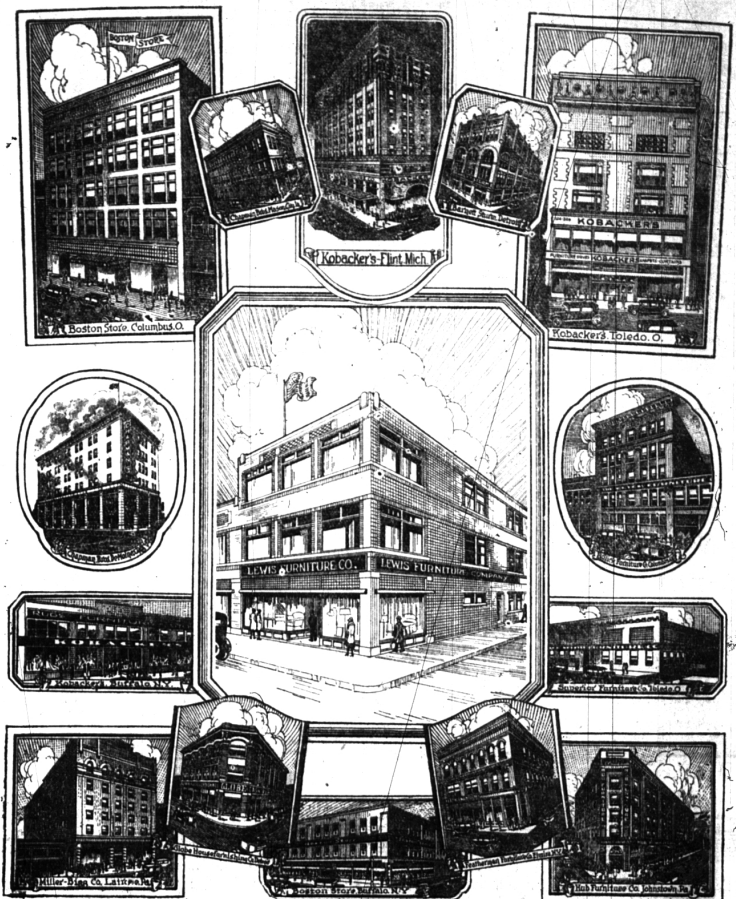
