FIRST VILLAGE LIBRARY WAS ON NEW BRIGGS SITE

A \$200,000 business block stands today on a spot made historical by Birmingham pioneers. It is the Briggs Birmingham building, at east Maple and Woodward avenues a two story structure complete in every detail necessary to the modern business block.

Five well-stocked stores, feauring merchandise found only in metropolis, now stand ready to stract shopping villagers. On a second story modern, attractively transhed offices house various visiness, experience.

A few months ago this was the site-of one of the most historical landmarks in the village, the old library building. Until 1927 the old ity covered red brick building housed the village offices, the police and fire departments as well as the few volumes which then comprised Birmingham's library.
