Merritt Chase recently shot 20 quails at three shots. This is the best record yet.

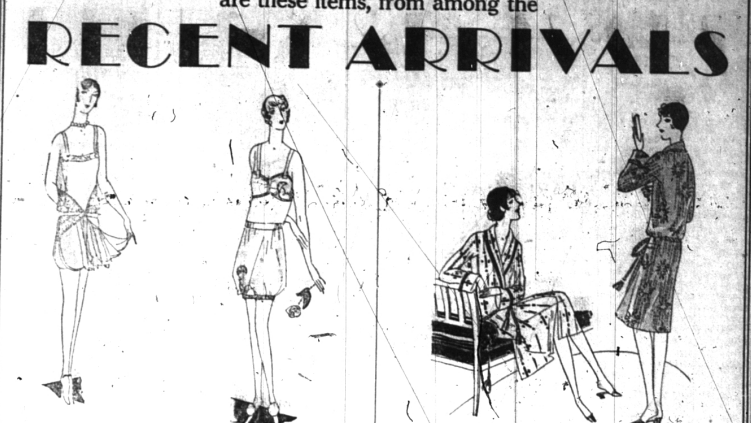
James Miles lost a horse on Saturday last. Cerebro spinal meningitis was what ailed it.
