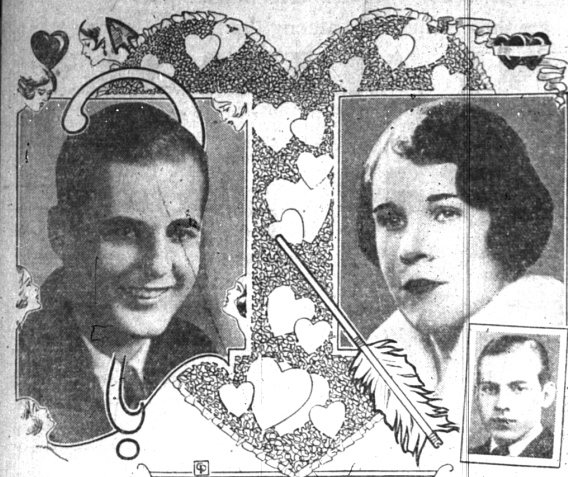

A golf ball driven by a player on the course of the Essex Falls, N. J., Country Club, landed in a tree and stuck there until the tree was shaken.

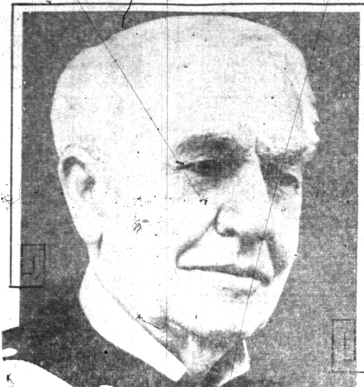
The municipal council of Bournemouth, Eng., voted to give the bodies of unclaimed paupers to Oxford University for dissection.

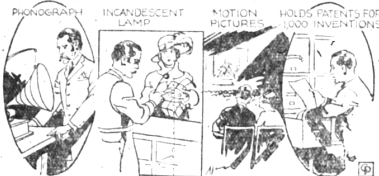
