ICE BOX COOKIES

(Mrs. Mary Morton's Daily Tested Recipe.)
One cup brown sugar, one cup white sugar, one cup melted butter, three eggs, well beaten, four and one-half cups flour, one heaping teaspoon baking powder, two teaspoons soda dissolved in two tablespoons water, one teaspoon cinnamon, one-half teaspoon cloves, one-half teaspoon nutmeg, one cup chopped nuts (walnuts, almonds). Cream butter with sugar, mixing thoroughly; add nuts, then dry ingredients sifted together; add flour. When thoroughly mixed (mix dough on bread board like bread), knead the dough and make into three rolls about two and one-third or three inches in diameter. Put in ice box overnight. Slice thin and bake in hot oven. The dough will keep a week in the ice box and it is always ready to bake.

MITCHELL NAMED BUREAU HEAD

James S. Mitchell of Holly today is president of the Oakland County Farm Bureau, following the election last week in Pontiac. The vice-president is J. C. Haines of Oxford.

The following directors were re-elected: Frank Williams, Highland; P. C. King, Waterford; Fred Beckman, Clarkston, and Mrs. Milo De Garmo, Highland. G. W. Klapp, New Hudson, was elected to fill an unexpired term on the board of directors.

Several resolutions were adopted at the meeting which according to officials should cause more than minor concern to county farmers. The eradication of bovine tuberculosis was stressed. The local bureau also passed a resolution objecting to the new regulations of station WKAR at Michigan State College by the Federal Radio Commission. The ruling makes the station ineffective for farm radio owners.
