CHANGES MADE AT BALDWIN

One change in the faculty and numerous changes in classes will be made at Baldwin High School to start the new semester.

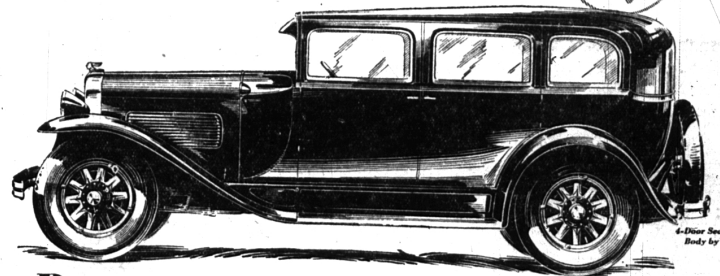
