units, the club and the hunt, he said. "For those interested in the club itself there are the stables, the riding ring, the dining room, and the round of social activities. The stables house about 80 horses, all but six of these being privately owned."
Coming to the second issue, Mr. Wright described in detail the hunts at the club. "The country in the vicinity of the club house has been stocked with foxes and it is estimated that at least 20 have their dens in that locality. Each hunt is carefully organized. It is in charge of a master, who is assisted by a hunter, who is assisted by a number of whippers-in. The master knows the exact location of the dens and starts the hounds from a favorable spot. Thus the hunts are conducted three times a week at the club, starting at 5 a. m., regulating the hour as the days grow shorter. Before each hunt the country is thoroughly patrolled.
