U. S. Department Of Agriculture Shows Oakland Is Hard Hit

Oakland County production of both fruit and grains has been curtailed in varying degrees by the cold and wet weather that prevailed almost continuously from about April 10 to May 25, it is announced today in the June crop report for Michigan, published by the U. S. Department of Agriculture in cooperation with the state agricultural department.

For those found guilty of a violation of the state drug act will be a probable prison term of five years. For the less serious offenders there will be months of prison service.

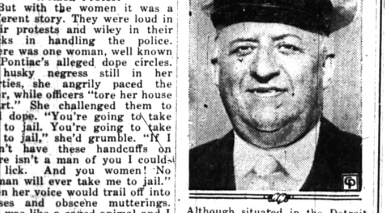
Storm Furnishes Light

In the commotion the raiders were handcuffed and the search for the narcotics started. Each prisoner was personally searched, with Miss Frances Glassford and Miss Eva Taylor, Pontiac police women, aiding.

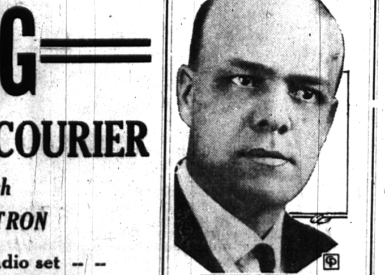
