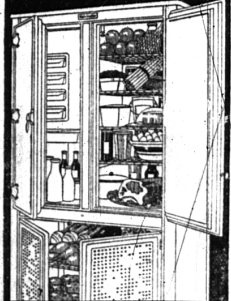

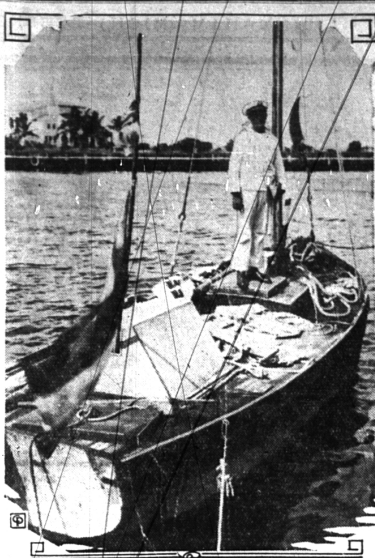

## THUG'S FRIEND IS SENTENCED

Youthful Robber Given Long Term in Ionian Reformatory

The companion of the two armed thugs, arrested in Birmingham, today is on his way to the Michigan State Reformatory at Ionia to serve from seven and one half to 15 years. The sentence was meted out by Circuit Judge Glenn C. Gillespie after the youth was found guilty of robbery armed. He is Nelson Sylvester, 20, of Detroit, and was convicted on testimony of Fred Hillen and Ray Turcott who were arrested by Lieut. Richard Lawler two months ago as they left the Birmingham Theater after having robbed a gasoline station attendant in Clawson. State's evidence was turned on Sylvester by the two youths after he previously had been questioned and released in connection with a robbery charge.
