

PRaise GIVEN NEW ASSESSOR

Praise was given the village commission for creating the office of full time assessor and selecting Albert W. Noonan to fill it, by the board of review in a letter to the commission.

Louis Haskell and Walter Connelly, who sat with Mr. Noonan during the hearings on tax assessments declared he is proficient and capable possessing a thorough knowledge of taxation. They further commented his courtesy in dealing with the public.

Co-operation between the commission and the assessor in forming a definite policy with regard to personal tax assessments also is suggested.

Mr. Noonan is the first full time assessor for the village. He assumed office in January when the commission decided the village had grown too large for a part time assessor. Robert K. McClellan was assessor previously.


