Captained by Donald Stewart, the Adams Junior High track team finished fourth in the county League and eighth in the county league and eighth in the county league...

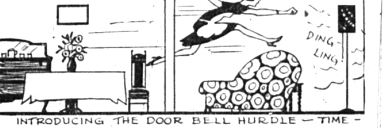
