SCHOOLS PROVIDE TENNIS COURTS

Additional Space Provided For Public At Adams School

A double concrete tennis court is to be constructed at Adams school, following action of the board of education Monday night. The court will be open for public play and will be constructed at an approximate cost of \$1,500, Louis Randall, business manager of the schools announced.

"We plan to lay the court east and west on the Adams playground grounds with removable posts so that it may be used for other recreation when tennis games are not in progress. It will not be fenced off but will be equipped with one backstop. The court will be constructed of concrete to insure its standing up under the normal recreational use of the playground," he noted.

Two double limestone courts are ready for play at the Barnum field, Mr. Randall announced. They were constructed at an approximate cost of \$1,100, he said.
