Actual instruction in boxing, base-ball, football, life-saving,

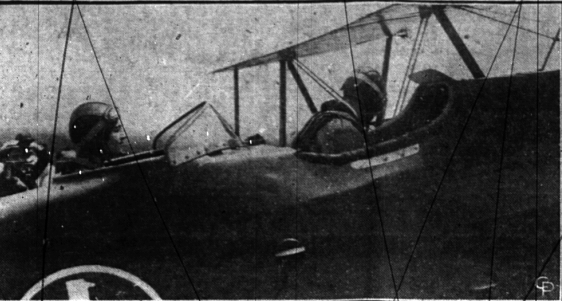

SPECIALIST URGES GRAPE SPRAY

The second application of grape spray is urged today by H. A. Cardnell, extension specialist for the spray service of Michigan State College.

The schedule calls for an application for black rot, berry moth and mildew, just as the blossoms are opening. The equivalent of eight pounds of copper sulphate, 12 pounds of hydrated lime and three pounds of arsenic of lead to make 100 gallons should be used. If rose-chaffer appears the caution is to use arsenic at double or treble strength and a gallon of the cheapest molasses. Do not omit this application, Mr. Cardnell says.

CITIZENSHIP PROPOSED FOR EXPATRIATE WOMEN

John L. Cable was born at Lima, O., April 13, 1884. He is a graduate of Kenyon college and Geology, Washington university. In 1908 he began practice of law at Lima. He was elected to congress in 1921 from the fourth Ohio district and has since served the fourth term of the republican party. ROYAL HOTEL GOES ON BLOCK

Toronto—The old Queen's Royal Hotel at Niagara-on-the-lake, which for more than 60 years has stood on the high bank looking out towards ancient Fort Niagara, is to come under the auctioneer's hammer. Next week it will be offered for sale—land, buildings and ancient furnishings. Its passing may be the final phase in the disappearance of what once was a foremost center of fashion in the province.

Today the old hotel is desolate and deserted, though a carter still winds the antique walnut clock of circular design above the dining room door. It ticks quietly on but bids no cheer to the feast where once King George and Queen Mary sat down to meat. On the howling greens, fanned in many a tourney, and on the tennis courts, where champions have been matched, the grass stands knee-high.

Until recent years the Queen's Royal drew visitors from all over the continent during the summer months. It was a favorite haunt of wealthy southerners, and fashionable Toronto residents made it their summering place.

Shortly the spacious parlors will be congested with chairs and furniture from the bedrooms and parlors. There are some 100 bed-rooms, and most of them contain rare old furniture, richly upholstered beds, dainty writing desks, capacious bureaus and dressers, marble-topped tables, fine large mirrors and everywhere the wood is the same fine native

walnut with the mark of age upon it.

On the office desk are a number of old registers, in one of which dated 1885 is passed a list of 25 or 30 visitors from New Orleans who had registered there annually since 1875. The page signed by "George" and "Victoria Mary" on the visit of the royal party to the

hotel on Oct. 12, 1901, has been intruded to the keeping of the Historical Society.
