### ORDER REPAIR FOR SCHOOLS

Repairs and equipment for the Baldwin, Pierce and Quarton schools were authorized by the board of education Monday night upon the request of Louis A. Randall, business manager of the schools. The work will be done during the summer vacation, it is planned.

A "swing-up" back stop for the gymnasium-auditorium of the Baldwin high school was authorized at an approximate cost of \$265. Outside window sashes in the new addition of the Baldwin building and the interior of five rooms as well as numerous walls and ceilings throughout the building will be painted.

A sum of \$300 was granted for a tile drain and catch basin on the north side of the Pierce building. Window frames of the Baldwin Quarton school. Heretofore the Quarton playground has been un-equipped, Mr. Randall pointed out.

Mr. Randall was authorized to purchase weatherstrips for the Quarton school at a cost of \$879.20. The board also moved approximately \$300 to be spent for playground equipment for the Quarton school.
