Mrs. F. H. Douglas of Evergreen, signed legal papers to that effect. Twins were born, so they adopted them both.

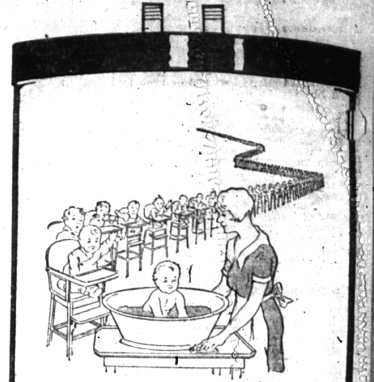
