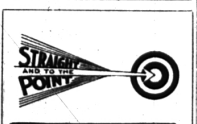
2 DISORDERLIES PAY FINES HERE; BUT DENY LIQUOR

Edwin Freeman, 191 north Saginaw, Pontiac, is in Oakland County jail today serving a 30-day sentence on a charge of drunken and disorderly conduct. He was given an alternative of \$50 fine. Freeman entered a second plea of not guilty Thursday in Justice Floyd S. Buck's court but was found guilty on a disorderly charge. Sergt. Delos Anderson and Patrolman Isma Banks of the Hills police testified Freeman was drunk.

He was arrested early Tuesday morning by the Hills police in the company of Edward Carroll, 13010 Kerchival avenue, Detroit. The latter, who police say was driving his car in a zigzag course north on Woodward avenue, pleaded guilty to a disorderly charge Tuesday in Buck's court, paying a fine of \$35.

Freeman told police that Carroll, a stranger to him, had offered him a "lift" to Pontiac. He accepted and soon discovered that Carroll was drunk, he said. Neither Freeman nor Carroll would admit owning a bottle of alleged whiskey found in the car, police said.
