us on Easter Sunday.

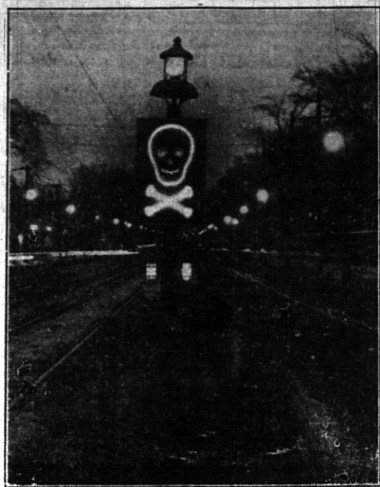

Increased motor traffic is nota-
ble in Birmingham since the first
warm spring days that heralded
the call of the open road. Driving
hazards are increased accordingly
and the local police department
and officials of the vicinity are
making every effort to curb the
number of accidents.
In Detroit an illuminated skull
and crossbones, the recognized
symbol of death, is being tested

out for the enclosed safety zone,
and a small rubber sign outlined
with reflectors at the unprotected
zone at Van Dyke and Lynch
road.

During 1928 there was a total of
22 deaths and 468 injuries in ac-
cidents occurring when vehicles at-
tempted to go through protected or
unprotected safety zones in De-
troit. This is in comparison with
338 such cases during 1927, result-
ing in 11 deaths and injuring 436.

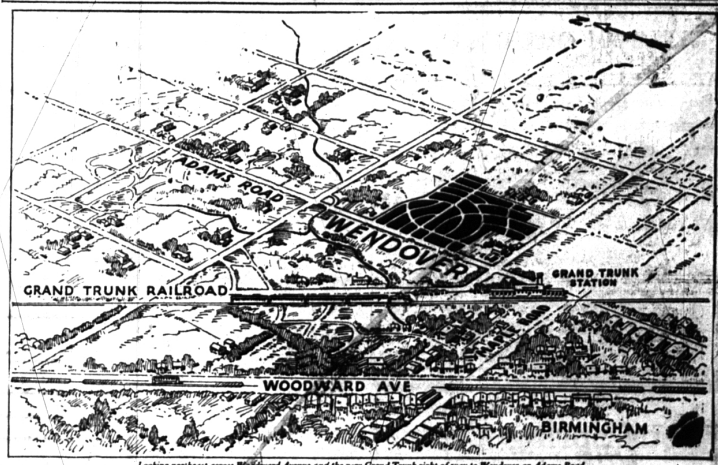
