

ROTARIANS OF MANY LANDS ASSEMBLE AT DALLAS, TEXAS

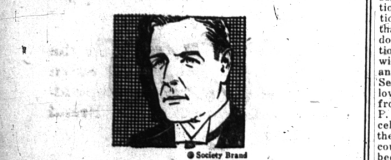

Dallas, Texas, May 15.—Almost in the center of the Western Hemisphere, the Rotarians of the world will gather here for their twentieth annual convention May 27-31, to renew their international friendships and to decide upon their program for the coming year. Delegates representing more than 3,000 Rotary clubs in 48 different countries will be in attendance, an increase of four countries in the Rotary family in the past year. Rotary clubs have been established recently in Greece, Egypt, Palestine and Yugoslavia, among the 286 clubs which have been formed in the past year in thirty-two countries.

The proximity of Dallas to Central and South America has made it possible for unusual numbers of Rotarians from the countries there to make preparations to attend the Convention, and also for post-convention tours of the States through Mexico and Cuba. 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seas parties will reach Dallas Monday after leisurely sightseeing tours through various sections of this country. The European delegation has arranged a week's tour of the South enroute to Dallas. The largest delegation from Japan ever to attend a Rotary Convention has been promised by Umekichi Yonoyama, Rotary leader in the Far East and one of the best known financiers of Japan. Special trains from all parts of the country will reach Dallas next Sunday and Monday, and many of them will proceed to Mexico, California, and the national parks of the west after the Convention.

On Monday afternoon the voting delegates will meet to discuss Rotary legislation to be presented to the Convention. In the evening is the beautiful Procession of Flags in the stadium, when the colors of the 48 countries in which there are Rotary clubs will be ranged around a mammoth Rotary Wheel, symbolizing the international-fellowship of the organization. A band concert accompanies this lovely spectacle. International President I. B. ("Tom") Sutton of Tampico, Mexico, will open the Convention formally on Tuesday morning with the president's annual address. Few have traveled so widely as Tom Sutton, who has visited Rotary clubs in 26 countries since he became a member of the international board of directors. From his travels he has gained an unique viewpoint on the problems to be solved in order that the international fellowship of the organization may be strengthened, and that Rotary may make its tremendous influence felt in the cultivation and maintenance of a world-wide friendship between peoples and governments. Reports of the Secretary and the Treasurer follow, and then the annual message from the Founder of Rotary, Paul F. Harris, will read. International celebrities will be introduced to the American Rotarians, and the countries which have never before been represented at a Rotary Convention will be officially welcomed into the organization.

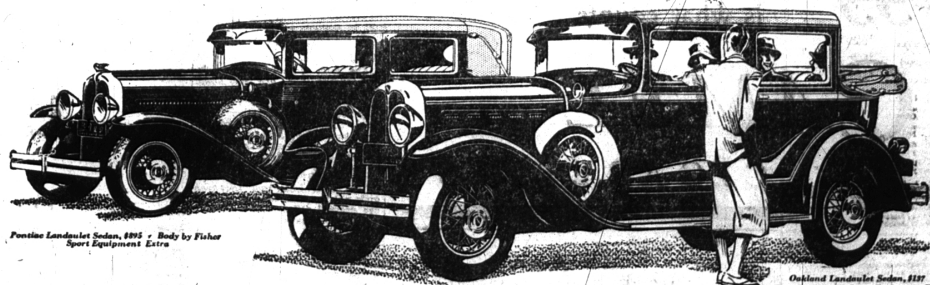

TSCHICHIWAPEKI, an Indian name, meaning a highly salted body of water, has been connected to Chesapeake, the name of that alluring inland sea that cuts Virginia in twain and almost bisects the state of Maryland.

No wider than a river at its head, the Chesapeake broadens to a width of 22 miles in the 105 miles to its joining with the sea. Its maximum depth is 165 feet and gross area about 5,000 square miles. It is fed by some 50 tributaries, ranging from two to 100 miles in length. The chief one of which is the historic Potomac. These tributaries harbor numerous villages of quiet charm that hold ancient colonial homes of rare beauty.

This remarkable bay became known to white men quite by accident: in 1607 when some passing vessels were blown into its mouth.

The Chesapeake is a great sea-food bin, producing more oysters than any other body of water in the world. During one year, Maryland and Virginia, which embrace its produced oysters, crabs, terrapin and fish valued at almost \$14,000,000. It also is a great wild-fowl refuge. Its sheltering bays famed as habitats for myriads of winged tribes. Again, it is an outstanding commercial utility, bearing upon its bosom great cargoes of the world's foreign goods in both this and foreign lands.
