3800 VISIT SCHOOLS HERE

Exhibits in Village Hold Interest of Record Crowd

Approximately 3,800 persons visited the annual school exhibits held here Wednesday, Thursday and Friday of last week, say Superintendent Clarence Vliet. This number is estimated as the attendance at Baldwin High and Junior High School, Adams Junior High, and the Hill, Barnum, Adams, Pierce, and Quanton grade schools.

Of this number the majority attended the exhibit at the high school. It is not known exactly how many attended this showing, but by a mechanical count kept by the Maroon and White, official school publication, 1,054 persons visited the manual arts exhibit. Most of those attending the exhibit pass this point, and thus it is figured that approximately 1,200 of the total were in this building.

The Baldwinian, the annual publication of the graduating class of the Baldwin High School which records events of the year, is being distributed today and ranks among the finest ever completed, a review shows.

Finished in the Peter Pan motif, the book in designs and imitation leather cover is done in green. Suitable designs embellish the pages and the division pages are scenes from the Barrie classic.

The 1929 Baldwinian is the first of the yearbooks ever published here to include news and pictures of both January and June classes. The 1929 January class is the first to graduate from here in mid-winter.

The annual this year is noted especially for good pictures, not only of the individuals of the classes, but of the groups and school organizations. All are exceptionally clear and true-to-life. The photographs of the members of the graduating classes are treated in a new way. Instead of the customary mounting in vertical panels along the sides of the pages, they are mounted in double rows at the top, with the legends regarding the student activities underneath the panels of pictures.

An especially large list of photographs of different clubs and groups in the school is included.
