Great-Grand Parents Of Clarence Vliet Honored At Ceremonies

A public ceremony marked the unveiling of a monument Saturday to Aaron and Sarah Webster, 1822 and great grand parents of Clarence Vliet, superintendent of Birmingham schools, who was the principal speaker on the program. Members of the Webster family association from throughout Oakland County were in attendance.

The history of the Webster family from the time of the arrival of John Webster, of Warwickshire, Eng., who came to Massachusetts Bay Colony in 1639 to Aaron Webster pioneer of Auburn Heights, was sketched by Mr. Vliet. He told of the building of the Webster sawmill, of the building and the frame house, close by the Clinton river where they were attracted by the water power.

A family dinner was held at the Troy Center Presbyterian Church preceding the ceremony at Auburn Heights.
