STANLEY AVE. WATERMANS
273—Moved by Commissioner Hulbert that the following preamble and resolution be adopted:
Whereas May 26th, 1929, was heretofore fixed by this Commission as the time for the meeting to hear suggestions and objections to the construction of a 6" water main with appurtenances on Stanley Ave. from Wallace St. to Lincoln Ave. in the Village of Birmingham, and whereas due notice of the meeting has been given in the manner required by law to each person owning property in the Village of Birmingham, and the Commission established for such purpose, and the Commission duly met on this 26th day of May A. D. 1929 at 10 o'clock P. M. for the purpose aforesaid, and due hearing has been given to all persons making suggestions and objections to the proposed improvement, therefore
Be it resolved that a 6" water main with appurtenances be constructed on Stanley Ave. from Wallace St. to Lincoln Ave. in the Village of Birmingham, and Be it further resolved that all lots and parcels of land fronting and abutting on each side of Stanley Street within the district heretofore described be constituted Special Assessment District No. 177, upon which shall be levied and spread according to benefits, the sum of \$243.55, being approximately 39.5% of the cost of the project, according to an estimate heretofore prepared by the Village Manager and now on file with the Village Clerk, and
Be it further resolved that the Village of Birmingham shall pay from the general funds the amount of \$443.95, being approximately 61.1% of the cost of the improvement, and

CLAYVELLING LATHAM RD.
275—Moved by Commissioner Hazlett that the following preamble and resolution be adopted:
Whereas May 26th, 1929, was heretofore fixed by this Commission as the time for the meeting to hear suggestions and objections to the grading of Latham Road between Lincoln Ave. and Clawson Road between curbs to a width of 29 feet, in the Village of Birmingham, and
Whereas due notice of the meeting has been given in the manner required by law to each person owning property in the Village of Birmingham, and the Commission established for such purpose, and the Commission duly met on this 26th day of May A. D. 1929 at 10 o'clock P. M. for the purpose aforesaid, and due hearing has been given to all persons making suggestions and objections to the proposed improvement, therefore
Be it resolved that Latham Road be graded between curbs to a width of 29 feet from Lincoln Ave. to Clawson Road in the Village of Birmingham, and Be it further resolved that all lots and parcels of land fronting and abutting on each side of Latham Road within the district heretofore described be constituted Special Assessment District No. 176, upon which shall be levied and spread according to benefits, the sum of \$222.50, being approximately 45.5% of the cost of the project, according to an estimate heretofore prepared by the Village Manager and now on file with the Village Clerk, and
Be it further resolved that the Village of Birmingham shall pay from the general funds the amount of \$480.34, being approximately 54.5% of the cost of the improvement, and
Be it further resolved that the Assessor of the Village of Birmingham be hereby directed, in pursuance hereto, to make a special assessment according to benefits as herein provided on all taxable lands and premises constituting Special Assessment District No. 176 for the sum of \$222.50 as aforesaid, and impart the same to this Commission with all due haste.
