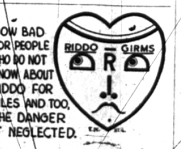

JUSTICE COURT END OF RIDE

Youths Given Unusual Sentence After Cruise in Other Man's Car

Arrested an hour after T. W. Miner, of Birmingham, reported his car stolen, Friday night, two youths were charged with being disorderly when arraigned before Justice Floyd S. Buck Saturday. They are Franklin Miller, 18, of 8545 Second boulevard, Detroit, and Clayton Passage, 21, of 13212 Cherrylawn avenue, Detroit. They were arrested in Bloomfield Hills by Patrolman Isma Banks and L. A. Martin who recognized the license plates on the car driven by the youths as those from the missing automobile.

Charges of larceny of an automobile were dropped when they explained to the satisfaction of the prosecutor's office they mistook Miner's car for their father's. The sentence meted out by Justice Buck was unusual. He ordered both boys to sign a pledge not to drink intoxicants for five years. For the next year both are forbidden to use an automobile without the permission of their parents. They were made to pay for the damage to Miner's car, and were fined \$25 each.
