### House Plans Expansion; Mrs. Fox Named To Board Of Directors

First steps are being taken this week for organization of a south Birmingham Nursery School project with members of the expansion and extension committee of the Birmingham Community House visiting social centers in Pontiac and Detroit.

A study of day nursery schools in these cities is being made by the committee which is headed by Mrs. L. N. Pyle.

Already a fund has been started for the day nursery school, with donations and proceeds from various organizations.

It is planned that the Sophie

Wright and the Tau Beta settlements in Detroit will be visited. The committee is also considering introducing a visiting nurse service in the village under the auspices of the Community House.


Mrs. Carleton Fox, of Riverside drive, was named Monday to replace Mrs. Howard Simpson, who recently resigned from the Community House board because of poor health. Mrs. Norman Lyle was elected treasurer to succeed Mrs. Simpson.

Plans are being formulated for a fund campaign to be staged in October to cover the running expenses of the Community House during 1930 and to clear the \$15,000 deficit of the 1928 campaign. Mrs. Charles J. Shain, president, announced. The new House is expected to be completed by Fall instead of January as previously planned.

Traynor, Pittsburgh's Big Question Mark

Much of the success the Pittsburgh Pirates hope to attain this year in the National league race depends on the ability of Captain "Pie" Traynor to stick to his post. Traynor suffered an injury while running the bases in a game with Philadelphia last fall and thought the winter's rest would be the only necessary medicine. But this spring's training season had not gone far before the big infielder realized he was not himself. An examination revealed a spinal injury and doctors ordered a long rest in bed. The immediate rest did not appeal to Traynor and he decided to go on as long as possible and take his rest later. He has been taking treatments and receiving some relief. But so far the cure is not complete and Pittsburgh fans are much concerned.

Without Traynor the Pirates would be in a sad condition. The opening game with the Cubs gave one illustration of what he means to the team.

You can be your own architect when you plan to build a log cabin, says Mrs. Mary Roberts Rinehart, author, writing in a current magazine.

"Draw the plan yourself, letting the cabin sprawl, keeping it low, and leaving spaces here and there where some day you may say: 'Let's put a room here,' and do it. Give it a lot of windows and plenty of doors to step out on to the good green earth.

The log house should be frankly of logs. The real log cabin lover wants his logs to show. Not for him the composition board lining, or plaster, or any such weak compromises. Trunk, he wants his logs stripped of bark, or in time he will have them shedding like dogs in spring. He may hollow them, inside the house, or he may paint them with boiled oil, and this has certain advantages. Even a faint varnish will reflect the lights of lamps at night and of those open fires which are the glory of all log structures."


