REV. MAGARY GIVES SPEECH

PROBE SINKING OF LAKE VESSEL

Detroit Minister Gives Talk To Baptist Brotherhood Community

Dr. Alvin E. Magary, pastor of the Woodward Avenue Presbyterian Church, Detroit, Tuesday addressed members of the Birmingham Baptist Brotherhood at a banquet given by the ladies of the First Presbyterian Church. The subject of Dr. Magary's talk was: "The Minister and the Average Man."

Dr. Magary illustrated the small difference between the layman and the average minister in brief eloquence, explaining that the average man, with average problems, attends church service because of his desire to be a good American citizen. Man's ideals of good citizenship were not founded entirely upon his individual success in the business world, but in his general character, and the church supported these ideals, he said.

He expressed the opinion that the present age, because of its fluctuating nature offers difficulties for the average father along moral and social lines.

"It is an extremely trying age," he declared. "It is difficult for the average father to be a good father, but the church answers that natural, normal aspiration of the soul."

The community singing was directed by Ray Peck and Mr. Franklin was soloist of the evening. During the event the Brotherhood voted to support the B-E Boy Scout Group and made plans for a Thanksgiving dinner for the Baptist Children's Home on the Thirteen-Mile road when they will entertain and provide appropriate offerings for the orphaned children there.
