BIRMINGHAM WILL OBSERVE 308TH THANKSGIVING DAY

The village of Birmingham tomorrow will observe the three hundred and eighth anniversary of the first Thanksgiving Day with traditional prayer offerings, turkey dinners, the customary football game, charitable gifts to the community's home beneficiaries.

The occasion will be similar to the observance in hundreds of other American communities, in vivid contrast to the original feast in bleak New England when a handful of fervent Puritans sat down to a simple but abundant meal with a hundred Indians as their guests.

On that occasion the Puritans, having built in a crude house built in the wilderness of a country little known to the rest of the world, were sustained by the generous Providence for preserving them from even more severe perils than they had undergone.

Officially Proclaimed in 1863. Each year the feast has been repeated but it was not until 1863 that the proclamation calling the nation to observe the day was made by President Abraham Lincoln.
